## Narrative paragraph writing

Purpose: To entertain or to tell a story.

- 1. <u>Setting</u>--Establish setting at the beginning. The setting helps to establish the mood. For example, if your story is a horror story and has an eerie mood it might be an idea to include a thunder storm in the setting.
- <u>Plot</u>—Simply tell what happens in the order that it happens. Focus on <u>one</u> incident. Because this is just a short paragraph develop only one character, or two at the most.
- *3. Climax*—Resolve the conflict of the story.

Study the examples below.

"The Ball Game"

It was a grey overcast day. As I sat in the dugout I wondered if the coach would ever put me into the game. I was sick and tired of riding the pine.
