
Psych 30 Inquiry Project Assignment










Step 1: Initial Source - some ways to find a good initial source

Examples from the search - . . a variety of sources to begin your study.






Podcast Listening Sources - you can search for "podcasts"




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Types of Video Tools Your Program Should Provide

Student Examples:

The following videos have been shared by former students who understand seeing a sample of a project helps give you a good idea of how to develop one yourself.

Technique examples in making this video you may notice:

- a) it starts with a black screen with no sound for a few seconds
- b) transitions into a short video clip
- c) music begins at the same time as the video clip but it fades in, so it doesn't start at exactly the same time
- d) there are transitions used between images/video clips they are mostly all the same transition with similar time
- to transition, so it doesn't create distraction but uniformity
- e) text is added and also uses an animation to scroll across a screen
- f) one music track is used at the beginning and fades out shortly after, while another music track begins softly and
- g) one thing <u>not shown in this sample</u> is adding in photos varying between video and images
- h) another thing not added for this project were sound effects or other sound layers of a conversation/narration ove
- i) note: your program should also allow you to separate the audio from a video file, so you can use audio sound while you change the image or even use the video imagery while you change the sound, lower the sound and do a voice over etc.
- j) you can <u>also layer videos over each oth</u>er, sometimes, <u>or layer sound</u>s (narrations + sound effects + music layers)
